

## What's been happening at St Josephs?

### **Aspirations Day**

Our theme for Aspirations Day was Big Dreams, we launched our day with an assembly to explore why it is important to have big dreams. Our pupils them had an exciting day learning about people who are well known for a talent or skill and who had big dreams.

EYFS learned about Dolly Parton, how she is not only famous for being a talented musician, but also build a charity to provide books for young children. Through the day they found out where Dolly lived, enjoyed some 'American food' and performed a line dance to her famous song 9 to 5. In year 1 and 2 the class learned about Katherine Johnson and her work with NASA. They created a presentation and beautiful space themed art work.





Marcus Rashford was the focus in year 3 and 4. They found out about how hard he had had to work to develop his amazing football skills and his passion for supporting disadvantaged children in schools. The class enjoyed demonstrating their own football skills. Our oldest pupils, in year 5 and 6 decided that they would like to work in smaller groups to research about different inspirational people. They worked hard to create presentations which they shared during our assembly.

## **Inventors Science Theme Day**

St Joseph's enjoyed a fabulous assembly learning about famous investors and learning about the impact the inventions have had on everyone's life and then it was onto the playground for the whole school to watch an invention in action. Much fun was had across the day, exploring and learning about inventions we love such as Lego. A huge thank you to Mrs Hill for organising the day! Our day ended with a brilliant fundraiser, selling some fun science toys for children to take home.





## Moving on into our classrooms...

In EYFS we are loving our topic of fairy tales, with have had great fun acting out the stories Aladdin and Snow White. As part of our learning about other faiths, we found out about celebrations for the Jewish festival of Shavuot. We made banana milkshakes and we painted with flowers as part of our learning.





In Year 1 and 2 we enjoyed finding out about Ole Kirk Kristiansen, who invented Lego, as part of our scientists and inventors themed day. We had the opportunity to work in groups to create some Lego Theme Parks after virtually exploring Lego Land in Windsor. This week we were introduce to Captain James Cooke and his exploration of Australia and New Zealand. We were lucky enough to have some of our parents join us for our Inspire Workshop. We build models of ships, designed boomerangs, created collages of the Great Barrier Reef and painted animals in the style of aboriginal art. We had a great afternoon and loved sharing our learning with parents.

This week, Years Three and Four have been working hard learning about 2D shapes. We have become experts at naming and describing quadrilaterals and triangles. On Thursday, we invited parents to join us for our Inspire afternoon and it was great to show them all we've learned about shapes. In writing, we have been reading and writing persuasive letters. This week, we have been planning a letter to Mrs Cooke asking her to build a leisure complex on the school grounds. The children have had some great ideas for their writing! In history, children have found out about crime and punishment in Victorian times. We have learned about the growth of the police force. In RE, we have found out about seasons in the church year and in science we are learning about famous scientists.

We have had a fabulous couple of weeks in Year 5 and 6, with many of our topics well underway! We have continued our learning of World War 2, looking at The Battle of Britain, The Blitz, Propaganda and how it was used in war time, as well as the different sides involved in the war. We even centred our INSPIRE afternoon around WW2, when we invited many of our parents into school, who helped in the creation of gas masks and model Spitfires and Messerschmitt 109's (two of the most prominent fighter planes involved in the war). Further to this, we are well underway with our practice for our end of year production. Children have been busy practising their lines, acting and singing all for this special performance in just over 2 weeks' time, it's certainly been all hands on deck!
